CHAPTER 1 – UNIVERSITIES

1.0 Background

There are four publicly funded universities in Manitoba, each operating under separate legislation. All four of these institutions are defined as universities under the *Council on Post-Secondary Education Act*. They are: the University of Manitoba (UM), the University of Winnipeg (UW), Brandon University (BU) and Collège de Saint-Boniface (CSB).

The UM is the largest, the most comprehensive and only medical-doctoral university in Manitoba. In addition to offering undergraduate and graduate education in arts, science and other fields, the UM offers programs in a broad range of professional studies. The UW, BU and CSB are all primarily undergraduate institutions, which offer undergraduate and a limited number of graduate programs in arts, and education, as well as specialized programs on an institution-by-institution basis. CSB offers university programming in French.

This chapter includes eleven sections of data and analysis on the four universities for the years 1998/99 to 2002/03. The first three sections include total, undergraduate and graduate enrollment data for all academic sessions combined, as well as regular and spring/summer sessions. The fourth section covers undergraduate and graduate degrees granted by gender. The remaining seven sections present additional detailed data and analysis at the faculty/school level for each university.

On some tables, data in this Chapter may differ from the 2002/03 edition. Data in this document should be considered correct, as some institutions have revised their data. Where this has occurred, “Revised” will be noted in the row that has changed.

1.1 Total Enrollment

1.1.1 Total Enrollment – All Sessions

The “total student enrollment for all sessions” is the sum of all full-time and part-time students at each university in Manitoba. This includes undergraduate and graduate enrollments in both the regular session and spring/summer sessions. Total enrollment equals student headcount, which is the sum of all full-time (FT) and part-time (PT) students.

“Full-time equivalent” enrollment (FTE) is a calculation that equalizes all students to full-time status. This calculation takes the number of part-time students and it divides by 3.5, which, according to Statistics Canada, will give a figure equivalent to the number of students attending university full-time. When this number is added to the number of full-time students, the result is FTE.

For the most part, enrollment data reported in the Compendium reconciles with published Statistics Canada data. However, Statistics Canada does not allow a student to be reported twice in one year, which is inconsistent with this document where a student may be counted twice if enrolled in both sessions. Therefore, data reported here may not completely parallel data reported by Statistics Canada.

Regular session data is reported by the universities as of November 1 annually, and includes only those students who have paid tuition fees. Spring and summer data is reported two days following the voluntary withdrawal date of the final summer session term.

Table 1.1.1 shows that for the five-year period from 1998/99 to 2002/03, the proportions of total student enrollment by university remained unchanged. UM accounts for just over two-thirds or 67.8% of total university enrollment, UW 19.9%, BU 9.9%, and CSB 2.4%.

All universities show a similar trend in enrollment change over the five-year period. Enrollment increased steadily in each year between 1998/99 and 2002/03. The largest increase in total enrollment was between 2000/01 and 2001/02 at the UM (7.7% or 2,192 students) while the largest enrollment increases at UW, BU and CSB occurred a year later (2002/03) at 14.8% (1,229 students), 9.2% (397 students) and 20.4% (191 students) respectively.

Between 1998/99 and 2002/03 total enrollment increased by 8,769 students or 22.4%. Following the same trend, both full and part time enrollment increased by 15.7% (3,558 students), and 31.7% (5,211 students) respectively.

1.1.2 Total Enrollment – Regular Session

Regular session at universities is from September to April and comprises one full academic year. Both full and part-time students enroll during regular session.

Total enrollment for regular session, as found in Table 1.1.2, shows a similar trend over time to that of total enrollment. Between 1998/99 and 2002/03 total regular session enrollment increased at all four universities by 6,570 students or 21.8%.

As expected, overall total FTE's also followed the increasing trend between 1998/99 and 2002/03. The only exception was the UM which showed a decrease in FTE of 166 equivalent students (0.9%) between 1998/99 and 1999/00.

Similar to the total enrollment data, regular session full-time enrollment (which comprised 76.7% of total enrollment in 2002/03) increased each year between 1998/99 and 2002/03, with the exception of 1999/00. Between 1998/99 and 1999/00 regular session full time enrollment decreased by less than 0.1% (13 students). This decrease was followed by annual increases from 1999/00 to 2002/03 (15.7% or 3,527 students).

Overall, there was an increase of 3,514 students (15.6%) in regular session full-time enrollment and an increase of 3,056 (39.6%) part-time regular session students over the five-year period.

1.1.3 Total Enrollment – Spring/Summer Session

Intersession, spring and summer sessions operate at universities between May and August and include both full and part-time graduate and undergraduate students.

Table 1.1.3 shows that between 1998 and 2002 almost all spring and summer session enrollment at each university was comprised of part-time students. BU and CSB did not offer full-time spring and summer session programming. In 2002, 97.9% of total spring and summer session enrollment were part-time students, and 2.1% were full-time.

By 2002, total spring and summer session enrollment (11,121 students) was nearing the last spring and summer session enrollment high from 1993 of 13,196 students.

Over the time period between 1998 and 2002, the proportions of regular session enrollment (76.7%) and spring/summer session enrollment (23.2%) of the total enrollment did not change.

1.2 Undergraduate Enrollment

This section includes undergraduate enrollment data from 1998/99 to 2002/03 by session, gender, age, and for international students.

1.2.1 Undergraduate Enrollment – All Sessions

As shown in Table 1.2.1, the proportions of undergraduate enrollment by university (UM – 67.3%, UW – 20.5%, BU -10.2%, CSB – 2.1%) remained relatively unchanged between 1998/99 and 2001/02, and are similar to those of the total enrollment by university, as shown in Table 1.1.1. However, in 2002/03, the proportion of UM undergraduate enrollment decreased to 65.7% of the total enrollment in the system, while the proportions of UW, BU and increased to 21.7%, 10.4% and 2.3% respectively.

Total undergraduate enrollment in Table 1.2.1 shows a similar trend to that of total enrollment over the five-year period, with all universities showing increases in each year between 1998/99 and 2002/03. During the period, total undergraduate enrollment increased by 8,461 students or 23.8%.

As with total full-time enrollment, overall undergraduate full-time enrollment increased by 3,478 students (17.1%) between 1998/99 and 2002/03. The exception was the UM with a decrease of 1.3% (187 full time students) between 1998/99 and 1999/00. Also, following the increasing trend of total part time enrollment, total undergraduate part-time enrollment rose by 4,983 students (32.9%) between 1998/99 and 2002/03. The exception to this trend was a slight decrease at the UW (28 students) between 1998/99 and 1999/00.

1.2.2 Undergraduate Enrollment – Regular Session

As Table 1.2.2 shows, undergraduate regular session enrollment trends are similar to those of total regular session enrollments, with increases at all universities between 1998/99 and 2002/03.

A comparison of total undergraduate regular session enrollments between 1998/99 and 2002/03 shows an increase of 6,299 students (23.3%) over time. CSB had the largest percentage increase of 274 students (54.0%). The largest total undergraduate enrollment increase in the five year period took place between 2000/01 and 2002/03 (2,435 or 7.9%).

Full and part-time undergraduate regular session enrollments showed a similar trend to that of total regular session enrollments. Overall, full-time enrollment increased by

3,434 students (17.1%), while part-time enrollment increased by 2,865 students or 41.7%.

1.2.3 Undergraduate Enrollment – Spring/Summer Session

Similar to the data on total enrollment for spring and summer session in Table 1.1.3, almost all undergraduate spring and summer session enrollment was comprised of part-time students. Additionally, comparing the data from Tables 1.1.3 and 1.2.3 suggest that full-time time spring and summer session enrollment at all universities was at the undergraduate level.

Between 1998 and 2002, total undergraduate spring and summer session enrollment increased steadily by 2,162 students or 25.5%. Overall, undergraduate spring and summer session enrollment comprised 95.8% of total spring and summer enrollment.

Enrollment at the UM counted for 67.1% of all spring and summer session enrollments in 2002/03.

1.2.4 Undergraduate Enrollment by Gender – Regular Session

Table 1.2.4 shows that women comprised a larger proportion of undergraduate regular session enrollment in each of the five years at all universities. Further, of the total undergraduate enrollment, the proportion of women increased from 57.0 to 60.2%, while the proportion of men decreased from 42.9% to 39.8% over the five-year period.

Of the total regular session undergraduate enrollment by gender at all universities, UM had the smallest percentage of difference in men (46% to 43%) relative to women (54% to 57%), while CSB had the largest (71% women, 29% men).

Analysis of total enrollment trends show that as the enrollment of women increased between 1998/99 and 2002/03 (4,481 or 29.9%), enrollment of men also increased (1,601 or 14.2%) but at a slower rate.

1.2.5 Undergraduate Enrollment by Age – Regular Session

As the data in Table 1.2.5 shows, the largest proportion of the undergraduate regular session enrollment by age between 1999/00 and 2002/03 was students aged under 20 years at all universities, except UM. At UM, undergraduate students aged 21 – 25 formed the largest proportion of its regular session enrollment in both of those years.

The data also shows that part-time students aged 26 and older, formed the larger proportion of undergraduate enrollment at UW and BU. Undergraduate students aged 33 and older at CSB, and those aged 27 and older at UM, were more likely to be enrolled part-time than full-time.

1.2.6 Undergraduate Enrollment of International Students – Regular Session

Table 1.2.6 shows that in general, undergraduate international student enrollment increased over the five-year period at UM, BU and CSB but not at the UW. At UW, international student enrollment dropped by 26.1% in 1999/00 and 2000/01. By 2002/03, international student enrollment had exceeded 1998/99 levels, growing by 48 students or 22.6% between 2001/02 and 2002/03.

The majority of undergraduate international students that came to universities in Manitoba were from Asia, with the exception of CSB. Data from CSB shows that for

1998/99, 2001/02 and 2002/03, the largest number of international students came from Africa. In 1999/00 and 2000/01, the majority of its international student enrollment came from Europe.

Some examples of the geographic location groupings for the international student enrollment shown in Table 1.2.6 are as follows:

1.3 Graduate Enrollment

1.3.1 Graduate Enrollment – All Sessions

Table 1.3.1 shows that over the five-year period, UM accounted for just over 90% of total graduate enrollment. This is to be expected, given that the other universities are primarily undergraduate institutions.

Although there were fluctuations in graduate enrollment on a year-over-year basis among UM, UW, and BU; CSB showed increases in graduate enrollment in each of the years between 1998/99 and 2002/03. Total graduate enrollment increased by 308 students or 8.5% over the five years.

Total part-time graduate enrollment followed the same general trend as total graduate enrollment, with a small decrease between 1998/99 and 1999/00, followed by increases between 1999/00 and 2002/03. Overall, part-time graduate enrollment increased by 17.7% (228 students), while total full-time graduate enrollment increased by 3.4% or 80 students between 1998/99 and 2002/03.

A comparison of graduate and undergraduate enrollment data shows that the graduate proportion of total enrollment declined from 9.1% to 8.2% between 1998/99 and 2002/03.

1.3.2 Graduate Enrollment – Regular Session

Graduate enrollment for regular session, as found in Table 1.3.2, shows a trend similar to that of total graduate enrollment. UW had an enrollment decrease of 20.0% (8 students) over the five-year period, while UM, BU and CSB had an increase of 7.7% (234 students), 16.4% (12 students) and 66.0% (33 students) respectively. Overall, graduate regular session enrollment increased by 271 students or 8.5%.

Regular session full-time graduate enrollment also showed a similar trend to total graduate enrollment, with an increase of 80 students or 3.4%, while total part-time enrollment increased by 191 students (22.4%) between 1998/99 and 2002/03.

1.3.3 Graduate Enrollment – Spring/Summer Session

As Table 1.3.3 shows, part time graduate enrollment for spring and summer session fluctuated between 1998 and 2002, but increased overall by 37 students or 8.5%. (All graduate students taking part in spring and summer session are considered part time.)

Over the five-year period, regular session graduate enrollment comprised 88% to 89%, and spring and summer session 12% to 13% of the total graduate student enrollment. Overall, graduate spring and summer session enrollment accounted for approximately 4% to 5% of total spring and summer session enrollment.

1.3.4 Graduate Enrollment by Gender – Regular Session

As the data in Table 1.3.4 show, women comprised a larger proportion of regular session graduate enrollment at UM, BU and CSB each year between 1998/99 and 2002/03. The data also shows that almost all graduate student enrollments at BU and CSB were on a part-time basis. Of the total graduate enrollment of women at UM, approximately two-thirds were enrolled in full-time and one-third in part-time regular session programs. Additionally in 2002/03, 73.2% of male students and 60.0% of female students were enrolled full-time in graduate programs.

1.4 Degrees Granted

1.4.1 Total Degrees Granted

As Table 1.4.1 shows, over the five-year period, the total number of degrees granted by Manitoba's universities fluctuated annually. The number of degrees granted decreased by 4.8% (271 graduates) between 1998 and 2000, followed by an increase of 6.5% (345 graduates) in 2001 and a decrease of 0.8% (47 graduates) in 2002. The number of university degrees granted increased slightly from 5,614 in 1998 to 5,641 in 2002 – an increase of 27 or 0.5%.

Of the total degrees granted by university in 2002, the UM/CSB granted 74.3%, UW 17.2%, and BU 8.5%, these percentages remained mostly unchanged between 1998 and 2002. The UM grants all CSB degrees.

1.4.2 Undergraduate Degrees and Degrees Granted by Gender

As Table 1.4.2 shows, over the five-year period, the total number of undergraduate degrees granted by Manitoba's universities fluctuated annually. The number of degrees granted decreased by 3.7% (184 graduates) between 1998 and 2000, followed by increases in both 2001 and 2002. Overall the number of undergraduate degrees granted increased by 2.1% or 105 graduates between 1998 and 2002.

Of the total undergraduate degrees granted in 1998, 57.4% degrees were granted to women and 42.5% to men. By 2002, the proportion of women receiving undergraduate degrees had increased to 61.1%, while the proportion of men receiving degrees had slipped to 38.9%.

Analysis by gender shows that over the five-year period, the number of women receiving undergraduate degrees increased by 8.7% (245 graduates), while the number

of men receiving undergraduate degrees dropped by 6.7% (140 graduates), due to enrollment decreases in earlier years.

1.4.3 Graduate Degrees and Degrees Granted by Gender

The total graduate degrees granted by Manitoba's universities between 1998 and 2002 declined by 78 or 11.2%, as shown in Table 1.4.3. The data also shows that in 1998 women received 362 (51.7%), and men 337 (48.2%) of total graduate degrees granted. In 2002, these proportions by gender remained the same, with women receiving 326 (52.4%), and men 295 (47.5%) of total graduate degrees granted.
