

CHAPTER 2 –COLLEGES

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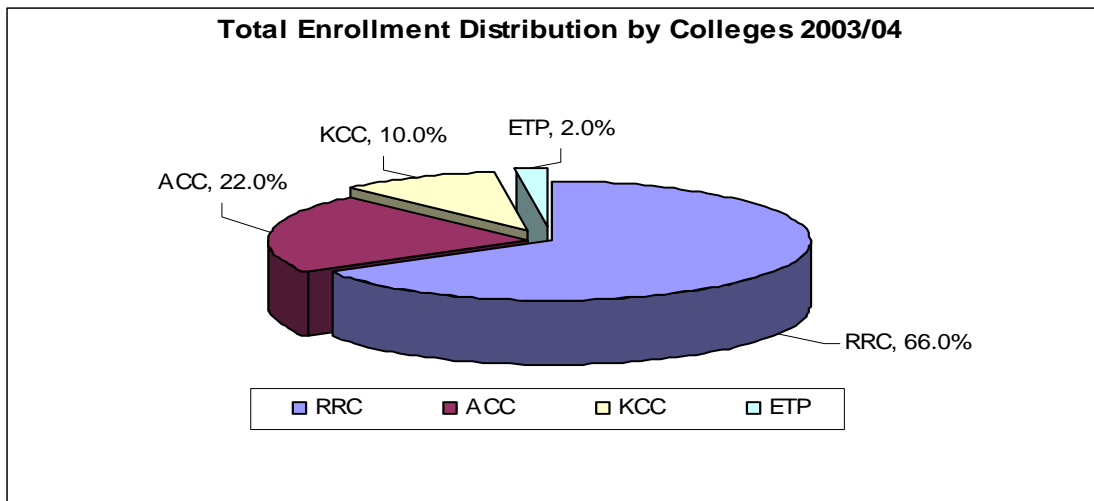
2.0 Background

The data in this chapter report on community college activity for the five year period between 1999/00 and 2003/04. Accordingly, information is reported on Keewatin Community College (KCC), as opposed to the University College of the North, which began operation in the 2004/05 fiscal year. The other institutions that are included in this section are Red River College (RRC), Assiniboine Community College (ACC) and École technique et professionnelle (ETP), the community college division of College de Saint Boniface.

2.1 Enrollment

College enrollment data are collected and reported in conjunction with Statistics Canada reporting methods. Data are reported annually as of August 31.

In 1999/00, distribution of total enrollment in colleges in Manitoba was: RRC (68%), ACC (21%), KCC (10%), and ÉTP (1%). By 2003/04, these distributions had shifted slightly, with RRC accounting for 66.0% of the total college population, while ACC accounted for 22%, KCC (10%) and ETP (2%).

2.1.1 Enrollment by College

As Table 2.1.1 illustrates, the colleges' enrollment increased steadily between 1999/00 and 2003/04. In the five year period, overall enrollment increased by 3,367 students (or 30.5%).

Enrollment on a full-time basis accounted for 88.6% of total enrollment in 2003/04. This is a decline of 6.0% from 1999/00, when full time enrollment accounted for 94.6% of total enrollment.

In addition, full-time enrollment increased by 2,312 students or 22.1% between 1999/00 and 2003/04. Similarly, total part-time enrollment more than doubled by 1,055 students (176.7%) between 1999/00 and 2003/04.

2.1.2 Enrollment by Gender

In general, based on the data in Table 2.1.2, males comprised 53.4% of total enrollment where as females are 46.6% of total enrollment.

Table 2.1.2 (a) illustrates that from 1999/00 to 2003/04, ACC, KCC and ETP tended to have a higher percentage of female students, where as RRC has majority of male students at 58.6% of the overall college population.

2.1.4 Enrollment by Aboriginal Status

Since Aboriginal status is self-declared by each student, there are limited data available for analysis. However, the data available in Table 2.1.4 indicate over the five year period enrollment of self-declared Aboriginal students increased by 39.0% or 625 students from 1999/00 to 2003/04.

Graph 2.2.1 (a) Graduates by College

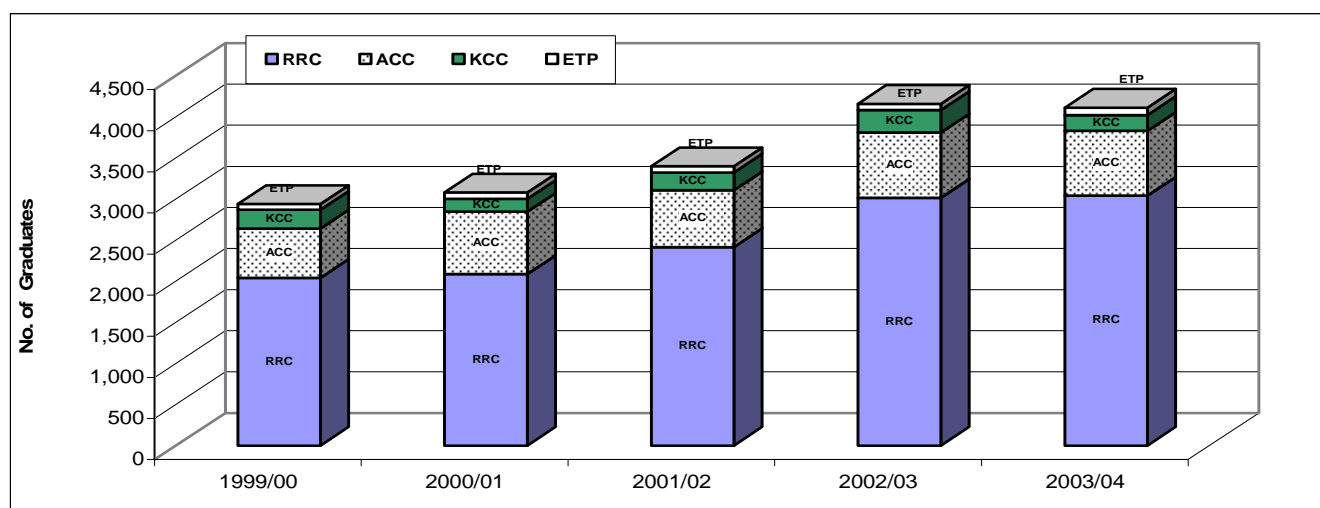
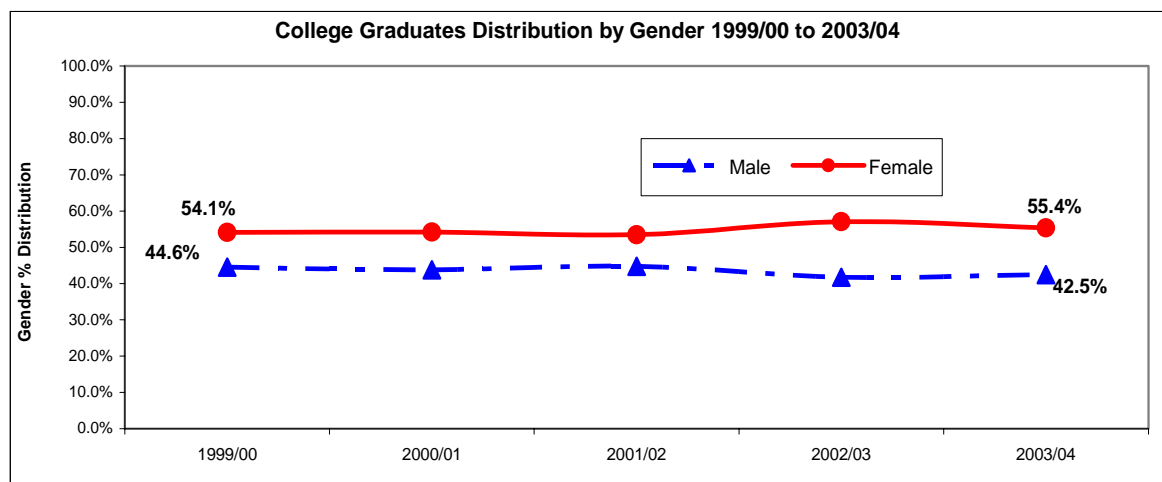
